The scientific programme includes more than 150 sessions featuring presenters from 65 countries. The programme includes:

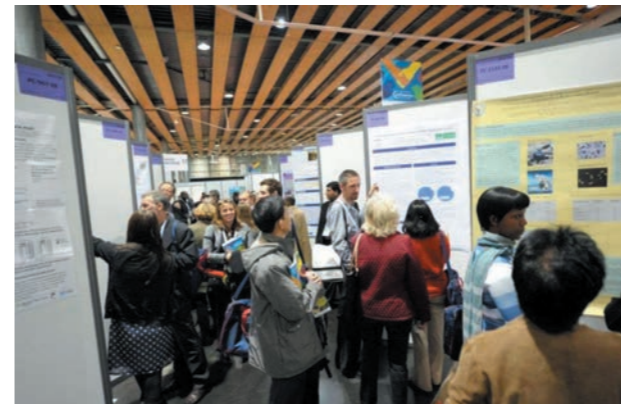
